It's the people vs The Texas oil Company, the people vs Jack Daryl Myrtle of the Trump administration, the people vs ETP, the people vs the government. Some people also believe that the pipeline helps make accommodations with individual landowners, minimize destructions, and achieve full restoration on impacted land. Mr. Horlbeck is a native who has to live with scars on his body after struggling in a fight with the police. He was edged with a number 4838 in a parking garage. He witnesses pepper spray with 400 arrests and violation. The Army Corps of Engineers still continue to destroy the Missouri River which includes fruit orchards and plowed whole wheat. This evidence is valid expressing how people felt witnessing their land bulldozed, one of their own have their arms bonded together in the position of animals, and disrespected with abuse and violence.
