

## **Channel View Pillars of Kindness**

### **Here's How It Works for Individual Students:**

If you see someone doing something unusually kind for someone else, you can nominate that person for Channel View Pillars of Kindness. Teachers as well as students can make nominations. *For example, if you lose your cell phone and a classmate finds it and returns it to you, you can nominate that person for Channel View Pillars of Kindness.* All you have to do is pick up a nomination form from Ms. Gonzalez or any Dean's office, complete it, giving the reason for the nomination, and submit it to Ms. Gonzalez. The person's name will be placed on a Pillar and the name will be read during a morning announcement. Once the names are announced, your name will be placed on a Pillar.

We'd like to see our Pillars of Kindness with as much names as possible, so remember to be kind and you just may have your Name written on Channel View Pillars of Kindness. Students will also be awarded PBIS ("Do the Right Thing") tickets every time you get caught doing the right thing.

### **Channel View Pillars of Kindness Guide for Individual Students:**

1. Observe someone doing something unusually kind for someone else.
2. Obtain a nomination form from the Dean's Office. (You cannot nominate yourself)
3. Complete the form and submit it to Ms. Gonzalez.
4. Names will be announced and placed on the Pillars.

### **Here's How it Works For Our Classes:**

Classes are recognized for fulfilling the components of the "Do the right thing" PBIS matrix with a star. The matrix is posted on every classroom door of our academy. The classes that earn a star for each component thereby completing the matrix by the end of the week will get a star in the sky round our Pillars of Kindness". At the end of each month the class with the most stars (at minimum 3) will earn special prizes determined by administration.

### **Channel View Pillars of Kindness Guide for Classes:**

1. Teachers and staff members can nominate classes for a STAR based on the "Do the Right Thing" PBIS matrix. (Teachers cannot nominate stars for their own official class)
2. Obtain a nomination form from Ms. Gonzalez. (You can also email)
3. Complete the form and submit it to Ms. Gonzalez.
4. A star will be placed on the matrix of the respective official class.

### **Here's How it Works For Individual Students:**

When students are doing the right thing, staff members will give a "YOU GOT CAUGHT DOING THE RIGHT THING" ticket to that student. Each ticket is worth 5 pts. At the end of the month, we will collect the tickets during each lunch period. Points will be tallied, and the student who has the most points per grade will be given a homework pass or a dress down day pass. They will also have their name inscribed on one of our Pillars.
